• Chris called the meeting to order at 6:34pm.

Interstate-Church Project Update

- Paul Del Vecchio presented on the Church project
- 132 units; 22 parking spaces
- First floor will have a gym, patio space and a café that blends into the lobby
- Project should take about 16 months
 - o Demo and abatement will start March 2019 and should be completed about Sept. 2020
 - Outside work should be completed within a year

Willamette Greenway Project

- The greenway on Willamette will stretch from Rosa Parks to Interstate
- Total budget will be ~\$94k \$180k to install diverters and speed bumps
- Temporary diverters will be installed at Villard/Willamette, and Jessup/Willamette
- Speed bumps will be placed on Atlantic (Rosa Parks to Ainsworth) and Willamette (Greeley to Interstate)
 - 250 300 ft is usual distance between speed bumps (~1 per block)
- The temporary diverters will be concrete barrels; PBOT will not plant the barrels but neighbors can
- Goal is to install in late March; will collect data for 6-12 mo. and install permanent diverters if warranted

Turner Construction/Adidas Noise Variance

- The City limits construction noise to 7a-6p Monday through Saturday and does not permit loud construction noise on Sundays.
- Turner has asked for a variance for the next five weekends to allow construction to begin on Saturday at 5:30am and end at 8pm, as well as on Sunday from 8am to 6pm.
- There was discussion on whether we oppose the variance.
 - Motion: Daniel Drake made a motion to have the OKNA Chair write and submit a letter to oppose the noise variance and include OKNA's disappointment with how neighbors were notified about the plans.
 - o **Board Vote:** Chris held a vote; all Board members voted to approve; no abstains.

- Public Safety (George)
 - o PSAC will be on April 11 from 6-8pm at Central NE Neighbors 4415 NE 87th Ave.
 - There will be another meeting on Feb 28 from 6-8pm at Emanuel Church in the multipurpose room
- Parks (Cynthia)
 - Patton Square Park project
 - Will kick off crowdsourcing project to raise ~\$30k for the project
 - Trying to get feedback from people who visit the park on what equipment they would like to see installed
- Events and Marketing (Addie)
 - Cynthia for Addie: August 31 has been approved as the date of the Overlook Movie in the Park;
 the movie is still TBD
- Neighborhood Get-togethers (Shannon)
 - Currently working on the next location and time
- Adidas (Stefan)
 - Spoke with David Ramos about contractors parking in the neighborhood and they are working on a solution
 - Also spoke with him about Adidas using houses for construction offices. He encouraged Adidas
 to follow City regulations but also to take the neighbors into account when placing temporary
 offices
- Transportation (Brad Halverson)
 - Will follow up with Overlook neighbors on the Willamette greenway project
 - Will also stay in contact with Adidas regarding updates to lights on Greeley
