## New business association forming in Overlook

The Overlook Neighborhood is home to many shops, restaurants and other businesses. For several years, however, they have not had an organized business association. That is changing thanks to the hard work of two local members of the Overlook business community.

Stacey Nuisl and Beau Bohanan were thinking about ways to promote businesses in the neighborhood. Their conversations became especially important as the pandemic struck and shut down many shops. They saw that in some other neighborhoods, a local business association could coordinate efforts to encourage people to shop, dine and do business here.

A business association also would provide an opportunity for small business owners to share ideas and practices. They'd be able to look to each other for advice and support. More than a dozen Overlook businesses have already expressed interest in joining according to Nuisl and Bohanan.

"From the conversations that I've had with individual businesses, all of them are just super appreciative that this is coming to light now," Bohanan said. Everyone seems so excited for a meeting for everyone to get together to actually work as a business community to enhance the Overlook Neighborhood."

Nuisl owns Hobbies Unlimited, and Bohanan is a designer and event planner who also runs trivia nights at Untapped.

Realizing that nothing would happen unless someone took the first steps, they contacted Venture Portland, which promotes local businesses in the city and helps them form neighborhood business districts. Venture Portland works with more than two dozen local business associations in Portland including in Kenton and St. Johns.

Once officially recognized, Venture Portland will help promote events for member businesses. They also provide training sessions that members of the local business association may participate in.

The local association also would work with Venture Portland to produce an Overlook visitors map highlighting member businesses and other attractions.

"Initially we're not charging any kind of membership fee," Nuisl said. "We're just gaining interest and trying to support each other through this crazy openings and closings and whatnot." In order to support local businesses during the pandemic, Nuisl and Bohanan started ShopOverlook.com. The website lists local businesses and details about what services they are providing at this time. Businesses that would like to be listed should visit the site and complete the join form.

Businesses interested in joining the Overlook business association can attend the upcoming organizational meeting. Follow their website ([shopoverlook.com](http://shopoverlook.com)), Instagram (@shopoverlookpdx) or Facebook for more details, including the date. At the meeting, business owners will discuss selecting a board and other initial setup.

# Interstate and Steel bridges to close for updates

Here’s one small bit of good news about the pandemic: the impact from bridge construction will be much less than it would have been a year ago. Talk about a silver lining.

There are two significant bridge closures coming up that may cause problems for Overlook residents.

## The Steel Bridge

By the time you’re reading this, the upper deck of the Steel Bridge will have closed to all traffic. It was scheduled to close on Aug. 2 and will remain closed through Saturday, Aug. 29. During the closure, TriMet will replace the track and switches along with upgrading their signal system on the bridge and just west of the river.

This is the second part of the work that closed the Rose Quarter Transit Center last summer. No cars, buses or trains will use the bridge during this time. Bus stops may be moved temporarily so buses can line up to use another bridge to cross the river.

Shuttle buses will take riders from the Rose Quarter Transit Center to the first MAX stops on the other side of the river. Note: The MAX Yellow Line will turn into a Green Line and vice versa at the Rose Quarter. To go downtown from North Portland, Yellow Line riders will need to take a shuttle or regular bus line.

Saturday, Aug. 29 will have an extended-area, one-day closure during which the Yellow Line will stop at Albina/Mississippi with shuttle buses available to go across the river. The lower deck of the Steel Bridge will stay open so pedestrians and bicyclists can use it. The bottom line: plan on your trip taking longer if it goes through downtown or the Rose Quarter. ## The I-5 Interstate Bridge

The northbound span of the Interstate Bridge on I-5 over the Columbia River into Vancouver will close from Saturday, Sept. 12 to Sunday, Sept. 20 to replace a cracked trunnion. A trunnion is the axle at the center of each wheel that lifts and lowers the center portion of the bridge. Similar work was completed on the southbound span in 1997.

That southbound span will stay open during this construction. There will be either one lane open heading southbound and 2 lanes northbound or two southbound and 1 northbound, depending on the time of day. A temporary divider will be moved twice a day so the center lane can switch directions. Planners anticipate four-mile backups for up to 16 hours a day could result, although the lighter traffic during the pandemic may make it more bearable.

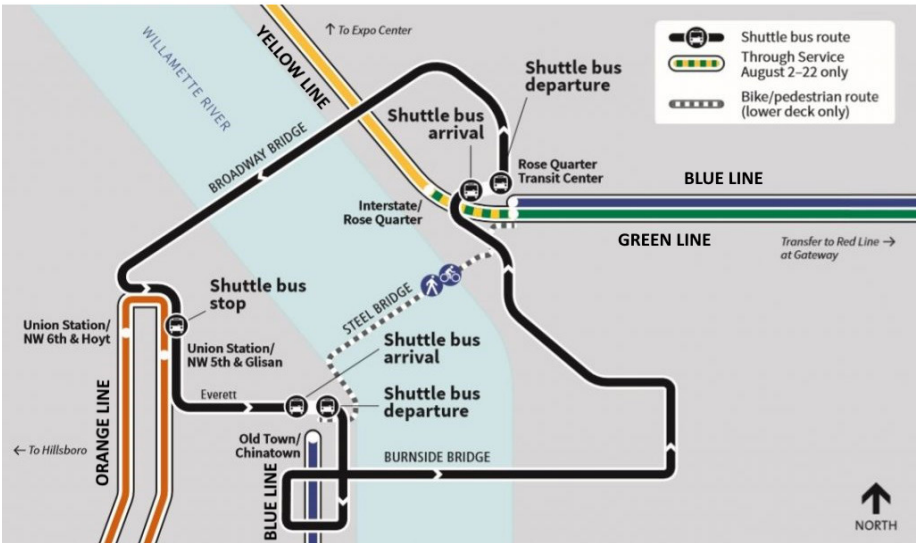
The other big impact is some freeway onramps and offramps must close during the project. The last open northbound onramp to I-5 on the Oregon side of the Willamette River will be at Interstate Avenue/Victory Blvd. The MLK/Marine Drive and Hayden Island onramps will close. Detours will send northbound drivers back to Victory Boulevard (Delta Park) to then head north. The detour will cause considerable congestion in that area.

The SR 14 offramp just north of the bridge will be closed along with the onramp from SR 14/Washington Street to I-5 south in Vancouver.

There will be other short closures before and after the main closure dates. Visit [interstatebridge.org](https://interstatebridge.org) for more information and to sign up for their newsletter.

-These projects will be worth the short-term pain for the long-term gain. Be careful on the roads during them no matter your choice of transportation mode.

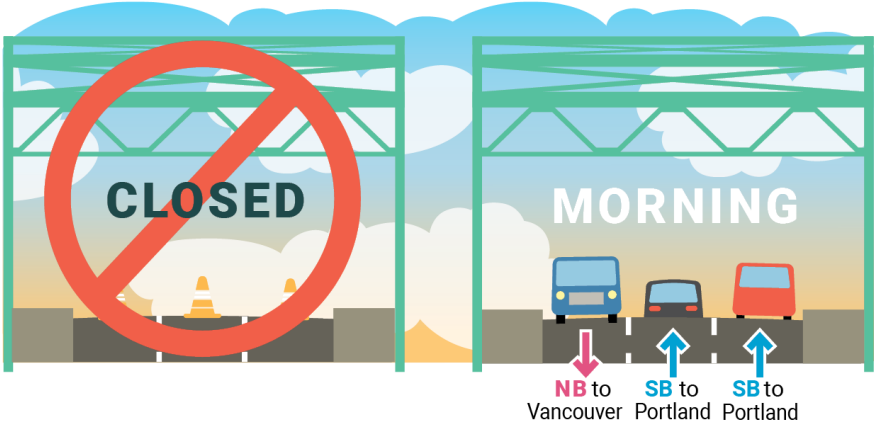
## Steel Bridge Closure Aug. 2-29



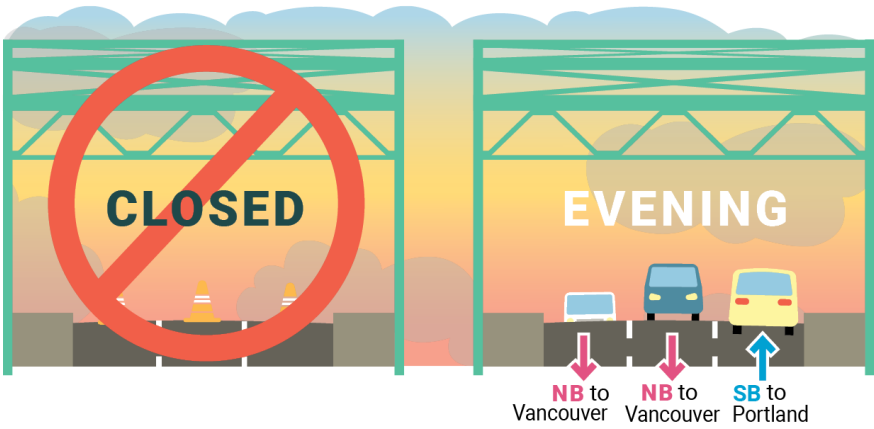
## I-5 Interstate Bridge Closure Sept. 12-20

Two northbound lanes and one southbound lane.

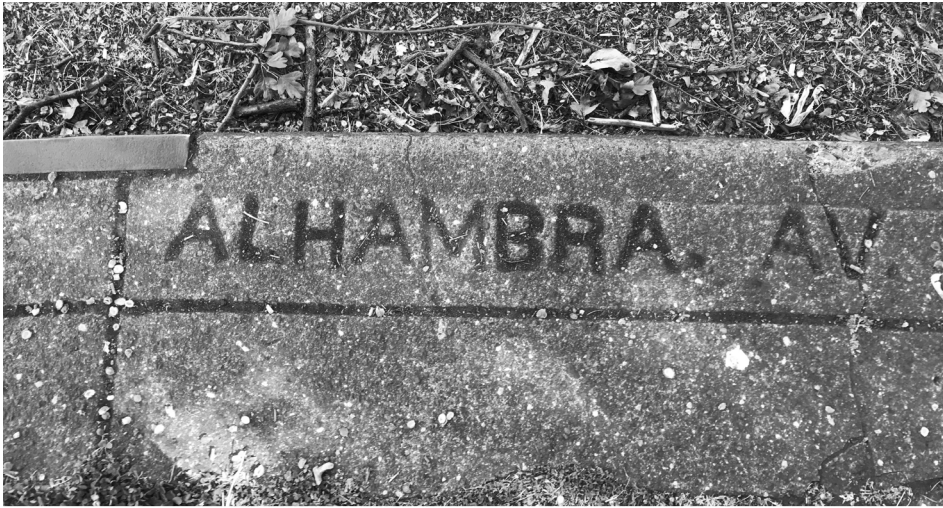


# Do you recognize these Overlook streets?

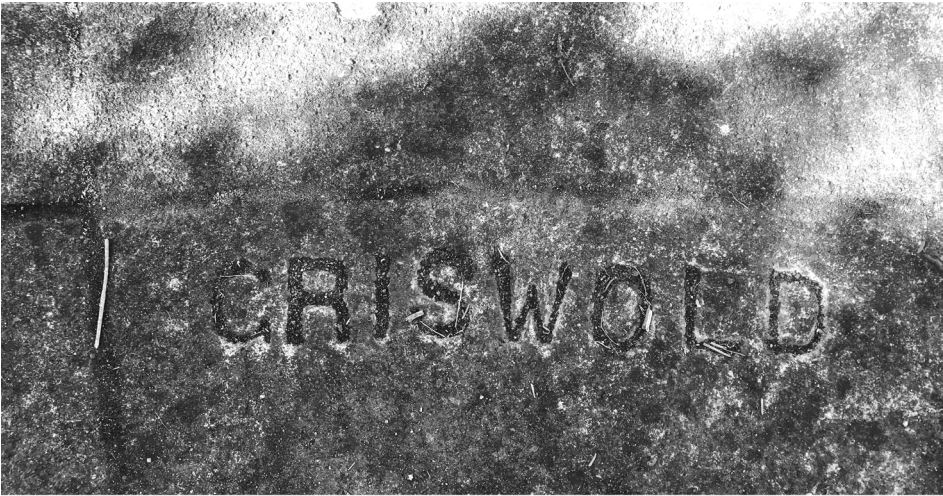
Below are four historic street markers that still can be found around the neighborhood. Do you know where these streets are? See page 4 for answers.

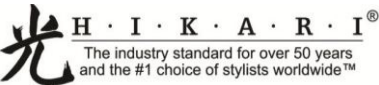
It will take time and effort but it's a rewarding experience and a great way to stay in the know about what's happening in your neighborhood.

# OKNA board member Cynthia Sulaski named 2020 parks champion

Congratulations to OKNA Board Member and Parks Chair Cynthia Sulaski for being named a 2020 U.S. Bank Parks Champion by the Portland Parks Foundation. The foundation named only two champions this year from 29 nominations. The U.S. Bank Parks Champion Award recognizes an individual who provided outstanding volunteer service to a park, community center, natural area or community garden.

Cynthia has championed Portland parks for more than 20 years, especially in North Portland. “I think parks and park programming play a crucial role in society. They give us the opportunity to explore and enjoy nature as well as the opportunities for recreating together,” she said. “We can’t give up supporting parks and park programming. They are the lifeblood, the heart and soul of our community. Without them, we don’t thrive. With them, we do.”

In announcing Cynthia’s award, the Parks Foundation noted:

Nominated for her volunteer work in North Portland including her work with Pittman Hydro Park, Patton Square Park, Overlook Park, and Friends of Trees to plant over 800 trees in Overlook, Cynthia is a problem solver who makes a difference for residents in and around Overlook as well as other areas in North Portland.

In addition to being an organizer for all things parks, she is also the first one to get her hands dirty whether it’s picking up trash or planting new trees. In addition to fundraising to build playgrounds, organizing park clean up days, planting trees and much, much more, she ensures that Movies in the Park in Overlook Park are kid-friendly and welcoming to all communities, year after year.

The award includes a \$1,500 grant that Cynthia can allocate to a project that enhances parks. She

asked that the grant go to the Overlook Neighborhood Association specifically for Summer Free for All Movies in Overlook Park expenses.

The OKNA Board thanks Cynthia for her continued service making Overlook parks special places that everyone can enjoy and for choosing to dedicate her award to support the beloved annual Movie in Overlook Park.

# Support Overlook with an (almost) effortless donation that costs you nothing

The Overlook Neighborhood Association is now connected to the Amazon Smile and Fred Meyer Community Rewards programs. Once you enter OKNA as your designated non-profit, each program generates donations to the neighborhood at no cost to you. Here is how they work.

If you have an Amazon online account, Amazon will donate 0.5% of the cost of your eligible purchases to non-profit organizations registered with the Amazon Smile program. Visit [smile.amazon.com](https://smile.amazon.com), click on “Get started” and then search for “Overlook Neighborhood Association.” Follow the prompts. Then, whenever you shop at Amazon, start your visit at [smile.amazon.com](https://smile.amazon.com).

If you shop at Fred Meyer and participate in their Rewards program, there is a Community Rewards option too. Fred Meyer donates a total of \$500,000 each quarter to the non-profit organizations that have registered with their program. # Greeley Avenue multi-use path opens

By the time you’re reading this, the Portland Bureau of Transportation should have completed improvements to N Greeley Avenue in the Overlook Neighborhood. PBOT has been working on that one-mile stretch of road for months as it installed a new multi-use path between N Going Street and N Interstate Avenue. The department expected to wrap up final touches in the final week of July.

The \$1.8 million Greeley project had been delayed multiple times. Construction finally began last fall.

The most noticeable change for travelers using any mode is the concrete barrier that now separates the two-way bicycle and pedestrian path along the east side of the road from traffic. This is a very busy street with a lot of truck traffic to and from Swan Island. Drivers often ignore posted speed limits and travel at high speed, especially coming off of Interstate 5.

The concrete separator was built using Jersey barriers that weigh 2 tons each. They stand 32 inches tall and are bolted to the ground. It should provide walkers and bikers with valuable distance and protection from vehicles on the road. Because it is on the east side of the road, bicyclists no longer will have to cross two busy ramps, one from Swan Island and one onto I-5.

The project also included improvements for vehicle traffic. PBOT widened the outer freight lanes to better accommodate trucks. It also resurfaced and repainted the entire stretch of road.

Greeley is an important bicycle route for North Portland to the Rose Quarter, Broadway Bridge and downtown. These improvements no doubt will make it even more popular. Bicyclists should keep in mind, however, that this is a multi-use path. That means it is shared by riders and pedestrians. Please be extra cautious and maintain safe speeds.



Southbound riders now cross over to the multi-use path at Going. A new crossing lane and bicycle signal will regulate flow there.

At the south end, the path routes past the Hazelnut Grove homeless camp. That city has said it will close that camp after it opens a new managed village in St Johns. That is supposed to happen later this year but given the history, delays remain possible. There has been no word about how PBOT plans to keep campers from disrupting the new path with vehicles or trash.

Bicyclists who prefer a more serene ride can take the N Concord Avenue Greenway, which passes through the heart of Overlook and connects to Interstate Avenue via N Overlook Blvd. That route requires going down the hill on Interstate Avenue, though.
