- Casey also reported that Johnny Lewis, who is in charge of the One-Point-Contact for reporting homeless camps, is encouraging neighbors to continue to report camps that are of concern. The city is still doing sweeps but only about 3 a week, down for the 40-50 that were done a week prior to the pandemic. Reporting at least once a week will keep eyes on camps that have biohazards, garbage, and criminal activity on the list of camps, that we need to send social services and get the area clean up.
- Cynthia reported Overlook is getting a nature path.
