OKNA Needs You to get on (the) Board

Every September, the Overlook Neighborhood Association (OKNA) elects at least six new members to join the board. Another six should be staying on to finish their two-year terms. Occasionally, board members resign before their term ends, and additional positions may be open.

Who can be on the board? If you live, have a business, own property, or are a designated representative of a non-profit organization within the OKNA boundaries (Fremont Bridge, Willamette River, North Ainsworth St, and Interstate 5), you can be a member of OKNA and therefore are eligible to be on the board.

What do board members do? They run the organization, gather and share information, take positions – usually with strong neighborhood support – on various topics, lead events, etc. The Chair and Vice-Chair coordinate the meetings, which currently occur on the first Tuesday evening of each month. The Secretary records the minutes of the meetings, and the Treasurer tracks the finances. We also have committees where board members usually lead and report the activities to the board. Those committees have a specific focus such as transportation, public safety, land use, communications, homelessness, membership, Parks and Open spaces, schools, and the one required one, a grievance committee. After the September election, the new board decides who will take on each role. If you are interested in reviewing the details of the roles of board members, email chair@overlookneighborhood.org so we can connect with you.

What have we done? Despite the pandemic keeping OKNA from meeting in person, we have met online. The pandemic has severely limited our in-person activities, which are at the heart of what we do.

We are looking forward to hosting annual holiday and summer parties, sponsoring the annual movies in the park around Labor Day, organizing neighborhood cleanups, and having developers present their projects before breaking ground to inform the neighbors and identify issues that hopefully can be resolved to make it better for all, working with Portland Parks and Recreation and the Bureau of Transportation on various projects, sending neighborhood email updates, and publishing a quarterly newsletter. That is a lot, but it all depends on what the board and the neighbors want to do. Many opportunities are waiting for you!

Want to run for a board position? E-mail chair@ overlookneighborhood.org stating your interest at least ten (10) days before the September 6th meeting when the elections will take place. Therefore, nominations are due by Saturday, August 27th. Nominees will be published on the OKNA website seven (7)

days before the election and sent out via our email bulletin. We hope that you will be able to step up and help OKNA make the neighborhood a better place.

Forty-eight different vendors will be at the market throughout the season.

Kenton Farmers Market is celebrating 12 seasons in the heart of the historic Kenton neighborhood in North Portland at N McClellan Street and Denver Avenue. It will have a selection of around 18 total local farms, flower growers, and food producers every Wednesday from 3 - 7 p.m. through September 28th.

We are excited to welcome several new vendors making their debut throughout the season at both farmer's markets. They offer sustainably grown heirloom fruits and; vegetables, medicinal hemp products, small-batch granola, vegan cookies, plant-based ice cream sandwiches, fermented foods, and more.

North Portland In Motion

There's perhaps no better time of the year than the first weeks of summer to get outside and go for a walk or bike ride around your neighborhood.

One of my favorite streets to walk or ride on is the N Willamette Blvd neighborhood greenway along the bluffs – if you haven't explored it yet, now is the time to check it out!

Over the past year, my job as the lead planner on PBOT's North Portland in Motion project has been to engage with people who live, work, learn, and play throughout the Peninsula to understand the transportation issues and key priorities for near-term projects that the city can deliver.

Nic Cota, the transportation chair from the Overlook Neighborhood Association, is a part of our Community Advisory Group and has done a great job representing your neighborhood since the beginning of the project.

In the Overlook neighborhood, neighbors have expressed concerns about speeding vehicles and needing better crossings on busy streets like N Greeley and N Killingsworth. We've listened to a need for slower speeds and more traffic calming on popular walking and biking routes that connect schools and parks like N Ainsworth and N Delaware. We've also heard a desire for better parking management in the neighborhood, especially in areas with lots of new mixed-use development in the N Interstate Corridor.

We plan on having several public engagement opportunities this summer, including a Pedalpalooza bike ride on August 6th focused on the Kenton, Arbor Lodge, and Overlook neighborhoods. We're also planning on having an Online Open House later this summer to share initial project ideas and continue the conversation with neighbors about what new projects and programs are most

important for North Portland. If you haven't already done so, please visit the project website – NorthPortlandinMotion.com, and join our mailing list to stay connected.

Update from the OKNA Transportation Chair

Ainsworth Letter

Last month, the Arbor Lodge and Overlook neighborhood associations came together to write a letter to the Portland Bureau of Transportation regarding Ainsworth. With increased speeding and reported street racing, we believe it's well overdue to prioritize safety improvements on N Ainsworth to curb this behavior and prioritize walking, biking, and rolling along this critical street for vulnerable road users.

HazeInut Grove

I met with Hazelnut Grove residents to listen to their concerns about transportation and whatever else has impacted them at their weekly meeting open to the public. Residents communicated that folks using the Greeley Avenue bike path are of the utmost importance and that any folks impeding that access more than temporarily are not affiliated with Hazelnut Grove. If there are still any access concerns, please contact me or report directly to the City at 503-823-SAFE.

North Portland in Motion

The City of Portland is currently planning near-term investments to improve biking, walking, and transit use in the North Portland area. This effort is called 'North Portland in Motion' by the Portland Bureau of Transportation (PBOT). As a community advisory group member, it's my responsibility to convey any desires or concerns from Overlook, so reach out to me or Mike Serritella at PBOT (Page 5). Also, check out Mike's article in this copy of the Overlook Views for more information about the plan.

Parking

We are amidst a lot of growth in Overlook, and many more housing units near the Interstate Corridor are still to come. Many of these new developments do not and will not include onsite parking, as allowed by Portland's zoning code. With the potential increase in vehicles needing to be parked on the street, Overlook may soon be looking at a form of parking benefit district in some areas. What this looks like, costs and benefits residents receive will be up to us. If you are interested or want to stay up to date, please reach out to me.

Lastly, a reminder that I lead a monthly bike ride starting at the Stacks Coffeehouse for Overlook residents. It begins at 10 am on the second Sunday of each month (August 14th, September 11th, October 9th) and is for people interested in learning how to get around Overlook by bike.
